Gaydon were just starting to arrive with everything from a Fiat 500 to a Ford GT40. Just about every major and some minor marques were on show including a Gordon-Keeble sporting a body designed by Giugiaro and Two very different Fords



built by Bertone. Only 100 Gordon-Keeble cars were ever built and according to the Owners' Club over 90 examples still exist.


