The Giro Panoramico this year covers new territory for us. There is an optional route-quiz to keep the passengers busy and a prize for the winner! If you want accommodation on the night before at The Bell, Alderminster, which is the start point for the Giro Panoramico - please contact the inn at http://www.thebellald.co.uk/. They have a small number of quality rooms and great food.

<u>Giro entrants</u> will need to pay for their coffee and biscuits in advance by obtaining a Giro Ticket from John Mills. On receipt of the completed application form, a cheque for your party (£5.50 per adult and £4.00 per child aged 5-12 years) and s.a.e., John will send the **Giro tickets** and a **CAD ENTRY PASS** for discounted entry to The Ragley Estate and Hall. This payment will also cover costs of your Giro Route instructions which you will receive during coffee on the day.

Your **CAD ENTRY PASS** will be shown as you enter the Ragley Estate and will qualify you for the very generously discounted entry fee of £10 per car which you pay to Ragley staff **on entry**. It will also enable you to have forward parking on the CAD designated site where Cotswold Section Marshalls will be there to guide you.

with a wonderful 6c 1750 SuperSport once again grabbing centre stage.




Very few 105's were on show with only a pair of Spiders bravely occupying the cashpoint spaces but

DRIVE IT DAY (DID) 2016 - BICESTER HERITAGE

Drive It Day fell on Sunday 24th April and we registered as a club to attend the Bicester Heritage Scramble. The venue destination is the UK's first park for the restoration, storage and enjoyment of vintage and classic cars, motorcycles and aeroplanes. It's home is something of a classic too, 348 acres of a historic 1920s RAF bomber station!

A small group of us met up in the centre of Moreton in the Marsh to take a drive across the Cotswolds to Bicester and the dedicated Alfa Romeo Owners Club parking that we had been allocated. My Series 2 Spider was joined by 3 Bertone Coupes, a Lancia Fulvia Coupe and a 916 GTV for a spirited run across to Bicester with plenty of other classics on the road it was great to see such a good turn out in support of DiD

The steady stream of classics making their way into the site was a good sign and it was a brilliantly attended event on a very evocative site. Time to explore and fortified with coffee and pastries or tea and a bacon butty we set out to take in the vast range of cars and vehicles in attendance as well as the

businesses on the site.



We also bumped into ex Alfa Bertone Coupe stalwart Richard Morris who was with the family in his 1939 Rover 14 which by his

own admission couldn't be hurried along like the old Bertie!



The site houses numerous classic car and bike restoration companies, from an exhaust specialist who has made exhausts for Bertone Coupes to Historic single seater race cars, Kingsbury Racing Shop Limited who are specialists in 4-Cylinder WO Bentleys and Pendine Historic Cars Limited who are based in the old Blast House and had a stunning array of cars for sale including a Sprint Speciale (with AROC sticker in the window) to name just a few.

Whilst we were on the site the row of Alfas had been joined by

a Giulietta TI, another S2 Spider (which I thought was familiar and on checking was Matthew Willmott's previous S2 Spider), a further 4 Bertone Coupes, a lovely chrome bumpered Alfasud Sprint, Alfa 33, 916 Spider and a Lancia Fulvia Zagato making for a great classic Alfa/Italian line up.

I'd thoroughly recommend a visit to one of the events and with further Sunday Scrambles and the Flywheel event coming up it's well worth a visit.

COTSWOLD SECTION MEMBERS MISCELLANY!

Spaghetti con aglio, olio e peperoncini

- Spaghetti with garlic, olive oil & chillies.



This is a classic Italian recipe; the main ingredient as always is the pasta and if you can get the old style long pasta this is even better.

The peperoncini are fierce dried red chillies.

The Italians as well as just enjoying this use it as a hangover cure!

Ingredients

- Spaghetti
- 4 cloves of garlic
- 2 or 3 peperoncini if you can't find them use two red birds-eye chillies
- 3 tablespoons of Extra Virgin Olive oil
- 1 tablespoon chopped parsley Flat leaf if you can get it

Method

Peel the garlic and cut each clove into four.

Put the garlic with the chillies into a small pan with the oil and warm over a very low heat. If you are using the peperoncini just crush them into the pan other wise chop them finely. Don't let the garlic burn or you will have a horrid bitter taste. When the garlic is just starting to go gold turn off the heat and leave the pan.

Cook the spaghetti al dente, drain it and put it back into the cooking pan.



Remove the garlic from the oil and throw it away, add the parsley and warm it through then pour the oil into the spaghetti and mix thoroughly.

Serve immediately, it is not normal to serve parmesan cheese with this dish.

A couple of variations on this dish are to sprinkle the top with crispy fried bacon which is delicious or if you like clams add cooked clams at the same time as the parsley. The tinned clams are fine for this.
