## **Coffee and Classics at The Motor Hub Sunday April 2<sup>nd</sup>**

A slightly chilly but dry Sunday morning saw Fran and I take the Spider to The Motor Hub near Bibury for their first "Coffee and Classics" event of the year.

On approaching the venue, we couldn't believe the sheer number of vehicles in the queue. However, a twenty-minute delay was fairly pleasurable because we had a Ferrari Mondial in front of us and a Maserati Spyder behind us. So the soundtrack was something special!

Once parked up, we grabbed a coffee and proceeded to look around the assembled cars and bikes that were driven to the event. To say it was a varied car park is not the full story. There was everything imaginable from Bond Bugs (Remember them?) custom cars, kit cars including a superb Lancia Stratos replica (Oh, yes please!) to the latest Aston Martin DB11 Volante which Fran took a shine to.

Moving indoors to the cars and bikes for sale, we had a low mileage Lamborghini Miura finished in trademark Miura Green and a factory restored Ferrari Dino that once belonged to Jean Todt (which was another car that Fran took a shine to - but at £325K, it was way beyond our means).



A factory-fresh Ferrari F40 sat in a corner with a sold sticker on it.



Next to this was an ex- Innes Ireland 250 Testa Rossa complete with the picnic hamper he used. You get the picture!

From an Alfa point of interest, a beautiful fully restored Montreal in a creamy white colour was for sale (£75k!) and in the private collection barn was a genuine ex Nuovolari P3. It was such a privilege to get so close to a car with all that history and of course it was a game changer for motorsport itself. Sadly, we couldn't take any pictures.

Alfa's outside numbered a few, including a smart 3 litre 916 GTV for which the owner had paid £400! Why can I never find these bargains?!

There was a lovely self- restored 1963 Giulietta Spider in Grey and a lovely 1975 Spider.



For many however, including me, the highlight was a 1948 Ferrari 166 "Barchetta " driven to the event and with its 1.5 litre V12 soundtrack filling the air – "Bellissimo"!
