Format

Familiarisation laps with instructors will begin at 9.00am when the circuit opens. There will be a 1 hour break for lunch from 12.30 to 1.30pm. The afternoon session concludes at 5.00pm when the circuit closes.

ALFAS IN NEW ZEALAND

Although I promised Fran that the holiday would be devoid of anything Alfa-related, you all know true "Alfisti" just can't help themselves. So what did I see? It was a surprising amount, actually. In the North Island around Auckland mainly the more modern cars, a few new Giulias of various models including a stunning blue Quadrifoglio and more Stelvios than I have seen in the UK!

As we travelled south, the more expensive models were replaced by new Giuliettas and the odd Mito. However, I didn't expect to see more than one 33, a tatty but still used 75 and various 156 and 159 models, mostly in Sportwagon form.
